ASIA

CHINA

ZBAD/Daxing International Airport

Beijing's new Daxing International Airport officially opened for business on Wednesday 25Sep with Chinese president Xi Jinping announcement. It is in time for celebrations marking the 70th anniversary of the People's Republic of China on October 1. The Airport's maiden flight was a China Southern Airbus A380 that took off from one of the airport's four runways. China Southern is Daxing's main tenant, but it hasn't accepted BA/GA flights yet. The new FBO is still in the processes of being built, with opening planned for 2020.

VHHH/Hong Kong International Airport

Hong Kong protest continues and it turns violent as protesters say they are 'willing to pay the price. Many of Hong Kong's National Day celebrations have been scaled down for fear of violence and the city is bracing itself for days of unrest.

NORTH AMERICA

USA

General

There were multiple closures of airports along the eastern seaboard as Hurricane Dorian made its northern track along the coastline. The airports greatest affected in the US spanned several states from the southern point of Florida up to airports along the coast in North Carolina.

BAHAMAS

General

Due to Hurricane Dorian infrastructure on the islands of Abaco and Grand Bahama were largely destroyed and floodwaters have made rescue and repairs difficult on the islands. Multiple causalities and serious injuries resulted from the hurricane. As of September 30, 2019 600 people are still missing and the death toll will continue to rise as debris are removed from the islands. Repairs to the airports on the islands are ongoing and airport authorities have stated that possible opening dates will be posted as the extent of the repairs is known.

HAITI

General

Many nationwide anti-government protests took place in Haiti on 30 September 2019. Streets were blocked and brought widespread transportation disruption to the country. The anti-government protests began to increase since the 27th of September and protesters have set fire to businesses and police stations throughout the country. Travel to Haiti is not advised until the violence subsides and peace is restored which could take weeks or months depending on government actions.

RUSSIA

URSS – Sochi

20OCT2100/19 26OCT2100 the below restrictions will be in place, due to the summit and forum of Russia and Africa 2019

1. Due to lack of stands, parking of Aircraft conducting charter and business aviation flights should not be on the ground longer than 1hr, with the exception of confirmed VIP flights.

2. For longer stops we recommend the use of Krasnodar, Anapa and Mineralnyy Vody aerodromes.

3. In case of change of arrival/departure time, or departure delays of more than 30 minutes Aircraft operator shall get a new slot from the Aerodrome operator.

4. When calculating fuel quantity one must consider that due to Sochi Aerodrome congestion long holding delays of arriving aircraft, and subsequent routing to alternate aerodromes are poss. if possible, Aircraft and Airlines shall not plan to refuel at Sochi aerodrome in order to reduce handling time.

5. In case of absence of necessary tow bar at Sochi aerodrome - operators of some Aircraft types shall carry towbars onboard. Check with Airport if this applies to your Aircraft type prior to operation.

TURKEY, EASTERN EUROPE, AND CENTRAL ASIA

UCFM/Bishkek Kyrgyzstan

Reminder - Aerodrome closed for maintenance every Monday, Wednesday and Friday between 1400-2100Z, through 25 Oct 2019.

UKDE/Zaporizhia Ukraine

The airport will be closed for runway repairs from 2nd Sep through 15th Oct.

AFRICA

DNEN/Enugu Nigeria.

The Airport remains closed for repairs. Return to service date TBA.

<u>Libya – General</u>

Flights are prohibited in the north-west part of the country (between 11-16 degrees East, and 30-34 degrees North), and any aircraft departing from HLLT, HLZW, HLMS, HLLM, HLGD and HLLS airports will be denied landing in Malta. In addition HLLM Airport is closed UFN.

EUROPE AND MIDDLE EAST

EUROPE

EPWA/Warsaw

The Airport has temporarily blocked all slots for GA/BA flights until the 3rd of October 2019. This restriction has been implemented due to on-going work in progress.

LIML/Milan Linate

Major construction works continue through until October 27, 2019. During this time, the Airport will be closed to all Traffic. Any Traffic operating to Milan will be diverted to LIMC during this period.

LIRN/Napoli

Due to high traffic volumes, coupled with complex Runway management procedures, the Airport is facing potential congestion. Therefore, LIRN Airport authority have temporarily decided to prioritize Airlines over GABA flights. CFMU Network Manager will be applying Cheery Picking Regulations to BA/GA flights, causing some delays to these operations.

EGZZ/United Kingdom Airspace- General

Exercise Joint Warrior (JW) will take place between Sunday 6th to Friday 19th October 2019. The exercise is a large-scale military multinational maritime, land and air exercise.

Intense aerial activity will be notified via NOTAM and take place predominantly in Scotland (including the Western Isles, North West Approaches, Galloway and the Borders region), North East England (including Spadeadam EWTR), and over the North Sea.

Within the Scottish FIR/UIR, 3 areas known as Fast Jet Areas (FJAs) exist, extending from the surface to FL 550; these areas will be notified by NOTAM. When activated, the FJAs will be afforded the segregated status of Special Use Airspace between FL245 and FL550. Intense aerial activity can be expected with large formations of fast jet attack aircraft conducting high-energy evasive maneuvers against opposing air defense aircraft. Below FL245 the FJAs do not hold segregated status; however, civilian aircraft are advised that if they proceed into the FJAs when active they should expect intense aerial activity with aircraft which may not be able to comply with Rules of the Air

OMDW/Dubai Airshow 2019.
